# CELEBRATING 85 YEARS

**Our** 85<sup>th</sup> annual meeting was a success. Thank you to those who were able to take the time to attend. We enjoyed a wonderful lunch provided by the Central Montana Cattlewomen.


Our attendance was up this year, with 149 registered members and more than 300 total people in attendance.

President Paul Descheemaeker reviewed the state of affairs for our nations electric grid and the concerning retirement of dispatchable power plants. Paul also updated everyone on the progress of the new building currently under construction in Roundup. The concrete pad was poured in early June during one of the few days when it wasn't raining. Project completion is currently scheduled for November.

I provided an overview of the work completed in 2022, as well as upcoming projects including a new transmission line in the Hilger-Winifred area. I also covered our plans for a revenue-neutral rate restructuring plan that we are developing.

### New Rate Structure

The new rate structure will include a monthly base charge, a lower energy charge, and a peak kilowatt (kW)

charge. The rate changes will be revenue neutral to Fergus Electric Cooperative but may increase or decrease your monthly bill based on your rate class and usage profile.

Many cooperative utilities in Montana have successfully implemented a three-part rate structure such as this. Our team is thoroughly reviewing our rate restructuring plan in a diligent and serious manner.

We understand that these decisions will impact our membership for many years to come. Our goal for fair and reasonable rates across all rate classes is our top priority. Strategic and intentional changes such as these will help a strong cooperative maintain stable and reasonable rates long into the future.

Our intention to implement these changes is occurring at a time when Fergus Electric's finances are stable and there is no need for a rate increase. As we finalize the details of our revenue-neutral rate restructuring plan, we will proactively communicate the information to our membership leading up to the anticipated effective date of January 1. As we provide additional information, I encourage you to contact our office with any questions you may have.
